

Symbol Representation of Total Population

- Large Circle: 10,000 individuals
- Medium Circle represents: 1,000 individuals
- Half Medium Circle represents: 500 individuals
- Small Circle represents 100 individuals³
- Half small circle represents 25-50 individuals³
- Small x represents 10-25 individuals³

¹ – Bunjevci - An Croatian ethnic group that traditionally speaks Bujevac dialect.

² – Šokci is an ethnographic Croatian group that traditionally speaks an old-Štokavian dialect.

³. The total population figures are rounded up or down to the closest 50. Population of 76-99 is symbolized as 100. Population of 25-75 is symbolized as 50.
