Important Information: The national boundary in **black** depicts the national boundary of Hungary prior to late 1938. The national boundary in **red** depicts the new boundary between Hungary and Slovakia that was established between November 1938 and March 1939. As a result of the Munich Conference (September 1938), Czechoslovakia was divided into the Protectorate of Bohemia and Moravia, Republic of Slovakia and sub-Carpathian Rus' (Carpathian Ruthenia). The First Vienna Award (November 2nd, 1938)

provided Hungary part of southern Slovakia. In mid-March 1939 Hungary, with permission from Germany, occupied the sub-Carpathian Rus' region up to the Polish border. The *Volkstumskarte von Ungarn* maps do not show the territorial gains of Hungary after 1939. To see a map of territorial gains of Hungary (1938 to 1941) go to:

The 1st to 3rd level administrative boundaries depicted on the *Volkstumskarte von Ungarn* correspond to administrative boundaries that were in place in during the 1930 Census of Czechoslovakia and Hungary.
