|  | Staatsgrenze | National Boundary | |
|  | Banschaftsgrenzen | Provinces & Administrative District of Belgrade | 1 st Level Administrative Boundaries. Comprises of 9 Banovinas (Banats) and the Administrative City of Belgrad. |
|  | Bezirksgrenzen | Districts | 2 nd Level Administrative Boundary Subdivision of a Banovina |
|  | Stadtgrenzen | City Boundary | 3 rd Level Administrative Boundary Cities within the Bavoninas of Danube, Sava and Drava |
|  | Gemeindegrenzen | Municipal / Town Boundaries | 3 rd Level Administrative Boundary found in all Bavoninas |
|  | Katastralgemeindegrenzen | Communes | 4 th Level Administrative Boundary within the Bavoninas of Danube, Sava and Drava |

Boundaries on the *Volkstumskarte von Jugoslawien* maps correspond to the administrative boundaries used in the 1931 Census of Yugoslavia. The Kingdom of Yugoslavia from 1929 to 1941 was divided into nine Bavoninas and Belgrade Administrative City District.
